Readings for May 16th & 17th



Acts 1:12-14
Ps 27:1, 4, 7-8
1 Pt 4:13-16
Jn 17:1-11a

Please read the Sunday Scriptures during the week to prepare your heart for Mass.

Acts 1:12-14: After the Ascension of Jesus, the apostles returned to Jerusalem from the Mount of Olives. They gathered in the upper room, united in prayer, together with the women, Mary, the Mother of Jesus, and His brothers. In this spirit of unity and faith, they awaited the coming of the Holy Spirit.

1 Peter 4:13-16: St. Peter encourages believers to rejoice in sharing in Christ's sufferings, for it prepares them to share in His glory. If they are insulted for the name of Christ, they are blessed, because the Spirit of God rests upon them. He urges them to suffer only for doing good, not for wrongdoing, and to glorify God even in the midst of trials.

John 17:1-11a: Jesus lifts His eyes to the Father and prays that He may be glorified to give eternal life to those entrusted to Him. He speaks of completing the work the Father gave Him and reveals that eternal life is to know the one true God and Jesus Christ, whom He sent. He then prays for His disciples, asking the Father to protect them and keep them united in His name as He prepares to return to the Father.

Taking a few moments during the week to prayerfully read these Scriptures will help you enter more deeply into the Word of God and better follow the message shared at Mass. It is a simple but powerful way to prepare your heart for our Sunday celebration.

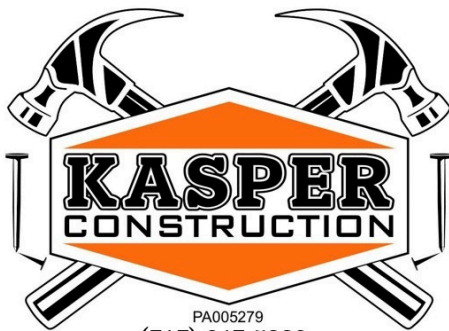
