Readings for The Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time

1st Reading - Jeremiah 20:10-13: The Prophet Jeremiah describes being surrounded by enemies who are waiting for him to fail and plotting against him. Despite their threats, he trusts that God is with him as a powerful protector. He is confident that his persecutors will ultimately be put to shame, while God will vindicate the righteous. The passage ends with Jeremiah praising God for rescuing the needy from the hands of the wicked.

2nd Reading - Romans 5:12-15: Apostle Paul explains that sin and death entered the world through one man, Adam, and spread to all people. However, God's grace through Jesus Christ is far greater than the effects of Adam's sin. While Adam's trespass brought death, Christ's gift brings grace and life to many.

Gospel - Matthew 10:26-33: Jesus tells His followers not to fear those who can harm them physically but to trust God, who knows and cares for them deeply. He encourages them to openly acknowledge their faith and promises that those who confess Him before others will be acknowledged by Him before God.

Taking a few moments during the week to prayerfully read these Scriptures will help you enter more deeply into the Word of God and better follow the message shared at Mass. It is a simple but powerful way to prepare your heart for our Sunday Celebration.

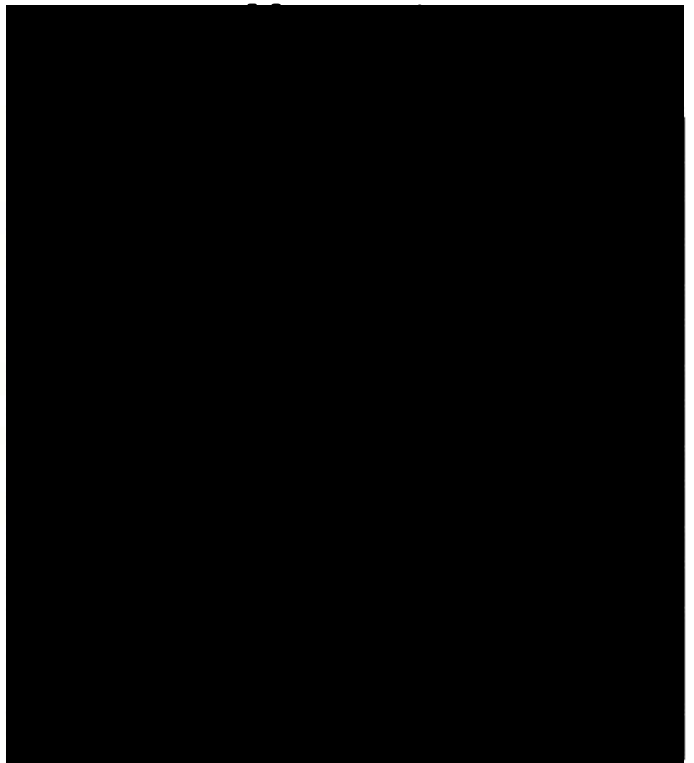
