Dear Friends,

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ—Corpus Christi!

St. Francis de Sales taught that the Eucharist is the greatest means of growth in the spiritual life. In the Gospel, the woman suffering from a hemorrhage said, "If only I touch the fringe of His garment, I shall be healed" (Mt 9:20). Her faith brought her healing through a simple touch of Jesus' garment. How much greater, then, is the grace we receive when we come into direct sacramental contact with Christ in the Holy Eucharist!

When we receive Holy Communion, Jesus enters our hearts and becomes intimately united with us. His presence touches our minds, our eyes, our hands, our tongues—our entire being. The famous saying, "You are what you eat," reminds us that what nourishes us shapes who we become. Each Sunday, and whenever we receive the Eucharist, we are nourished by Christ Himself. He becomes part of our lives and gradually transforms us into His likeness.

As you receive the Bread of Life today, ask the Lord to fill you with His virtues, especially His love, compassion, mercy, and generosity. May His Real Presence strengthen your faith, renew your hope, deepen your charity, and free you from all fear.

May Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament bless you and your loved ones abundantly.

Readings for The Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

Exodus 19:2–6a - At Mount Sinai, God reminds the Israelites that He rescued them from Egypt and brought them into a special relationship with Himself. He promises that if they remain faithful to His covenant, they will be His treasured people, a holy nation, and a kingdom of priests dedicated to His service.

Romans 5:6–11 - St. Paul teaches that God's love is revealed in Christ, who died for us while we were still sinners and unable to save ourselves. Through Jesus' death and resurrection, we have been justified, reconciled with God, and given the hope of salvation. Therefore, believers can rejoice in the peace and new life they have received through Christ.

Matthew 9:36—10:8 - Jesus is moved with compassion for the crowds because they are like sheep without a shepherd. He tells His disciples to pray for more laborers to serve in God's harvest. He then chooses the Twelve Apostles and sends them out to proclaim that the Kingdom of Heaven is at hand, giving them authority to heal the sick, cast out demons, and care for those in need. He reminds them that they have received God's gifts freely and should give freely in return.

Taking a few moments during the week to prayerfully read these Scriptures will help you enter more deeply into the Word of God and better follow the message shared at Mass. It is a simple but powerful way to prepare your heart for our Sunday Celebration.
